American System of Judging

1. Refer to “**Notice to Exhibitors**” rules 2&3 for entry dates.
2. Exhibits must be tagged and in the hands of the division heads between 10:00 am and 7 p.m., WEDNESDAY.
3. Entries must have been raised by exhibitor within the past year.
4. The quality desired in agricultural and horticultural products exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market, and such exhibits must be at least equal in maturity as that state of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural Code, in order to be considered for premium awards. Section 42513. “Mature” means having reached that stage of ripeness which will insure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.” Section 42515. “Overripe means having an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in the fresh state.”
5. In class “any other variety”, name variety on entry form
